

FOURTH ANNUAL JAZZ CRUISE IN THE WORKS

MÚSIC, FUN, FOOD AS NEW SHIP SAILS DOWN THE BEAUTIFUL CONNECTICUT

THIS YEAR, THE BIGGER, BETTER "BLOCK ISLAND"

THE FOURTH ANNUAL JAZZ CRUISE down the beautiful Connecticut is scheduled for Sunday, September 19. The boat will be the Block Island, much more spacious than the Nelesco of previous cruises. It will leave the muncipal dock at Middletown at noon, returning at 8 PM Tickets are \$10 each, though for parties of 20 or more, the price is \$8. To obviate queues lining up at buffet counters, box luncheons will be distributed. Ample parking space is available at the municipal dock and the adjacent municipal parking area, with police protection provided. As always, there will be continuous music, this year by the splendid Oliver Jackson Trio from New York, the Spider Martin quintet and singers, and omnipresent jazzmen always keen to join a session. Tickets are being made available to the public at Korvette's in Hartford and at the LaSalle Music Shop in West Hartford. Members of the Society will sell most of the tickets, which may be obtained from Graham Ralph (525-1269), if not at the meeting which will be held Sunday evening, July 18, at Jonathan Temple, 700 Blue Hills Avenue.

THERE LL BE DANCING and stuff like that there at the special meeting to be held Sunday evening, July 18. The band, not yet chosen, will be of the sort to lure Lindy hoppers (frug is a nasty four-letter word) onto the floor. Chief purpose of the meeting, however, will be to outline plans for the forthcoming cruise and to distribute tickets for that momentous event. (Its financial success will make the 1965-66 year the best in the annals of HJS.)

Incidentally, Oliver has been receiving great praise for the records and movies he's been making as Earl Hines' rhythm man.
