"QUARTET LAUNCHES SOCIETY'S SEASON ON STRONG NOTE" was the headline on Ron Georgeff's review of the October meeting as it appeared in "The Hartford Times." The JPJ Quartet (Budd Johnson, Dill Jones, Oliver Jackson, Bill Pemberton) gave a well organized, programmed history of post-twenties jazz with comments prefacing their musical demonstrations. "Above all," reported Mr. Georgeff, "these four men have fun and let the audience in on their merriment." You had to be there.

NOTES from a frayed cuff: There's good music at the Cavalier Room of the Netherlands Hotel (intersection of Farmington and Asylum Avenue). Bands playing there have been those of Bobby Johnson, Norman Gage and Ray Cassarino. The place is open every night... Several HJS members recommend a spot called McTiff's in New Haven, where the music is given by the Count Steadman Trio... Jaki Byard's latest record, "The Jaki Byard Experience," was given five stars by "Down Beat." ... Before the old Earl Hines quartet disbanded in the summer (thus creating the above mentioned JPJ Quartet with Dill Jones taking the Fatha's place at the piano) it made a Decca platter, "Fatha Blows Best." It, too, has a five-star citation from "Down Beat."
