ROLAND KIRK, the multi-reed genius and multi-jazz giant, will be the concert guest of HJS on Sunday evening, April 12th, bringing the quintet with which he recently toured several nations in Europe. Few jazzmen have approached Roland Kirk's record. Item: In the most recent Critic's Poll conducted by "Down Beat" he was chosen as the No. One performer on miscellaneous instruments, and placed among the top five in the alto and tenor saxophone, clarinet and flute categories. Item: His two most recent records both received five stars in "Down Beat," his "Volunteered Slavery" album (Atlantic SD-1534) being cited as a record "no serious collector should be without." The last time he appeared before HJS, people had to be turned from the door.

NOTE: The concert will be held at Teferes Hall, 159 Blue Hills Avenue, beginning at 8 PM. Admission fee for members, \$2.50, for non-members, \$3.50. (Members include those whose 1969-70 dues have been paid.)

JUNIOR MANUE pleased everyone at the March meeting. Call him a Leprechaun or a Haile Selassi, you have to call his music fun. His companions were Bassist Martin Ravera and Drummer Charlie Crosby (deputizing for Oliver Jackson, who couldn't turn down a last minute European engagement). Lincoln Kaye of "The Courant" rhapsodized: "...glorious riffs and runs and stutters and sesenute trills. He gently heckles other people's solos with lisping little squibs." Ron Georgeff of "The Times," a bit more prosaic, wrote of Junior's playing: "nothing radical, but as main a mainstream as you can get, flavored with funkiness." HJS member Al Wilson joined to give robust vocal treatment to a ballad and a blues. (A word of praise to HJS member, Dick Taylor, trumpeter and sound technician: The sound was excellent.)
