THE HAROLD VICK QUARTET will open the new HJS season. The choice stems from the enthusiasm and admiration with which this group was received when it played during the annual cruise down the Connecticut. Relatively new as a unit, the group is fast acquiring national renown. Two recent Victor records ("Straight Up" and "Watch What Happens"), well reviewed, have won them widespread recognition. The quartet consists of Harold Vick, reeds (veteran of Howard McGhee, Duke Pearson and Walter Bishop groups); Sam Jones, bass ("eminently capable modern bassist," according to "The Jazz Encyclopedia," and former member of units led by Dizzy Gillespie, Thelonious Monk and Cannonball Adderly); Freddy Waits, drums (late of the Sonny Rollins Trio and of Gerald Wilson's big band); and Joe Bonner, piano (who, though comparatively new, obviously wouldn't be a member of this group if he weren't a superior performer).

NOTE WELL the date and the place: Sunday, October 18, 8 o'clock, at Jonathan Hall, 700 Blue Hills Avenue.

THE 9TH ANNUAL JAZZ CRUISE was the most successful of the series — musically, financially and in all other respects. Good weather, joyous companionship and smooth sailing made the day almost perfect. The music was of the sort that a well-heeled nightclubber would blow his wallet for: five stars chosen from the great, starstudded Thad Jones & Mel Lewis Band — Reedman Jerome Richardson, Pianist Roland Hanna, Bassist Richard Davis, and, of course, trumpeter Thad Jones and Percussionist Mel Lewis, with the Harold Vick Quartet (see above) alternating.

POSTSCRIPTS to the cruise: Lost on board — man's navy blue long-sleeved sweater-shirt; woman's white cashmere cardigan sweater; and one pair prescription glasses...Found on the boat — gray knitted belt...A number on board (including "The Hartford Courant" reporter) were disturbed became the bands could not be heard throughout the boat. The reason, unknown to most, is that, after Dick Taylor's amplification system had been installed, the boat's electric converter failed.
