ITS TENTH ANNIVERSARY will be celebrated by HJS on Saturday evening, April 24 at the handsome Hartford Jewish Center Auditorium in West Hartford, with Kenny Burrell and his fine unit as guest performers. Admission, \$3.50 in advance, \$4.00 at the door. Visitors from other jazz clubs of the east will be present, and everybody can become acquainted with everybody else during the champagne reception following the concert. Miss this party and you'll never be able to look yourself in the face again. Now will anybody else.

THE ELVIN JONES QUARTET, guests at the HJS concert in March, pleased not only members & guests, but also the press. Victor Sasson of "The Courant," in a column-long review, praised Frank Foster, Gene Perla and particularly Joe Farrell ("pure lyricism on the alto sax"), though critical of Elvin's "massive solos." Ron Georgeff of "The Courant," however, praised Elvin for "such sweet thunder" and "black storms of sound," meanwhile commending the group for its "symbiotic energy." Emil Hoginsky of "The Springfield Daily News" termed Elvin "simply a master percussionist," adding that "if you are a jazz fan or merely one who appreciates the workings of musicians, HJS is a comfortable crowd to be with." More than 300 were present. Unhappily, many visitors had to be turned from the door.

"HARTFORD JAZ? SOCIETY MARKS 10TH BIRTHDAY" says a headline on Page One of the "Downbeat" news section. Readers learned, if they didn't know it already, that "the society holds monthly concerts featuring the best available talent, conducts an annual jazz cruise down the Connecticut River, and sponsors worthy students through scholarship grants to Berklee College of Music..."

INCIDENTALLY, there are beautiful solos by Kenny Burrell in his "Guitar Forms" (Verve) with arrangements by Gil Evans, in his "Blues, the Constant Strain" (Verve) with Clark Terry, Jimmy Owens, Richard Davis, et al., and in the Thad Jones-Mel Lewis album, "Jazz Wave, Ltd." (Blue Note).

The annual Eastern American College Jazz Festival is scheduled there April 16 thrugh 18th, with the participants including bands from Columbia, Temple, Union, MIT, Kent State, Buffalo and other colleges throughout the east. Guests will include Clark Terry, Marion McPartland, Ernie Wilkins, Ed Shaughnessy and Comedian Woody Allen's Galvanized Washboard Band.

MONTREUX, SWITZERLAND will again be the site of a European jazz festival. The airline, Swissair, has suggested that HJS and other clubs of the Eastern Jazz Conference take advantage of a group rate enabling Yankee Jazz fans to attend. The cost: \$368., which includes air fare, hotel accommodations and admission to events. Dizzy Gillespie, Garry Burton, Jimmy Owens, Chico Hamilton, Oliver Nelson and other American jazzmen will be performing. Of particular interest to HJS members is the fact that their favorites, the PJP Quartet, will be present, and the aforementioned Connecticut aggregation from Quinnipiac College.
