Owen McNally of "The Hartford Courant" in his review of the concert by the Gary Burton Quartet split his pants, writing, in part: "Even seeing is not believing when it comes to Gary Burton, virtuoso vibraphonist...Backed by bass, guitar and drums, Burton soared through more than a dozen contemporary jazz compositions, effortlessly tossing off intricately beautiful arabesques of notes...Absolutely incredible are the only two words in English that would sum up his tour de force performance ...A five-star rating should go to the Hartford Jazz Society for once again sponsoring another excellent concert...If there were no Hartford Jazz Society, now twelve years old, it would be necessary to invent one...Who but the Jazz Society has in the past year offered the ministrations to the faithful by such as Herbie Hancock, Horace Silver, Clark Terry, Illinois Jacquet and the incomparable Mr. Burton?"

(Cecil Payne and Bill Nelson concert will be held at Church of Good Shepherd, Willys Street.)

JAZZ for your weekend is available on Friday and Saturday evenings at the Black Dog in Suffield.
