HORACE SILVER and his quintet will be guests of the Hartford Jazz Society on Sunday evening, March 25th, thereby fulfilling a dream long held by Society members. Though now an international celebrity, Hartford regards him as one of its own, for local jazz fans remember him from the days when he was startling listeners at the old Sundown Club here in town. He was "discovered" there by Stan Getz, who snatched him up to become a member of his quintet. Subsequently, he played and recorded with Miles Davis, Coleman Hawkins, Art Blakey and other Big Mames, ultimately achieving fame on his own as a champion of "funk." He comes to the Society from the Half Mote in Manhattan, where his playing was praised last week in a "New York" Times" review by John S. Milson.
