THE WISHFUL THOUGHT that Big Bands are coming back will be given a hearty boost on Sunday evening (8:30), November 18, when HJS brings to the Roberts Theater (West Hartford) the Berklee Faculty Concert Jazz Orchestra -- 14 jazzmen from the music college that has produced some of the foremost per- o formers of the past 30 years. The band consists of faculty members who have played with Buddy Rich, Woody Herman, Glenn Miller, Herb Pomeroy and other renowned leaders. Organized recently, it has been appearing in concert halls, at colleges and music festivals before audiences that have been moved to the most enthusiastic praises. This could be the most advanced and most polished big band on the scene today. Again the details: 8:30 p.m., Sunday, November 18 at the Roberts Memorial Theater, West Hartford.

THE ELVIN JONES CONCERT of last month surpassed the brightest expectations. Wrote Owen McNally of "The Courant": "Jones provided a rhythmic fortress of strength from which reedmen Frank Foster and Harold Alexander sallied forth with great success...Jones was a poet of the cymbals, a pointillist of the pedals and the creator of great membrane storms thundering from the bass and snare drums. He was Elvin Extraordinaire." So there.

All at 5 p.m. and all at 64m & Park Avenue...Coming attractions at the new Columbia Music Hall in West Hartford include Errol Garner (Nov. 23) and Dave Brubeck (Dec. 7).
