Each member of the group is well known to jazz fans: Roland Hanna (formerly with Benny Goodman, Charles Mingus and the Thad Jones-Mel Lewis band), Frank Wess (eleven years reedman and flutist with Count Basie), Drummer Ben Riley (percussionist of everybody from Woody Herman to Thelonious Monk) and Ron Carter (bass mainstay of such bands as those of Miles Davis, Gil Evans, Sonny Rollins and Herbie Mann).
