OSCAR PETERSON, probably the world's greatest jazz pianist, comes to town under the auspices of HJS on TUESDAY, MAY 14th. That's almost a full month from now, but here's fair warning -- get your tickets without delay, for, even though no publicity or advertising has appeared, many orders for tickets have already been received. Roberts Theater has a limited seating capacity. Tickets are now available to HJS members before the public sale, so it is extremely advisable to get them early. Order them and pay for them now! THE CLIFFORD JORDAN QUARTET scored heavily at the March concert. Said Owen McNally of "The Hartford Courant", in part: "The Quartet performed a dazzling jazz concert that ranged from sophisticated blues to a haunting elegy for John Coltrane...Each of the group showed that he knows what the blues are all about, yet the Quartet showed that it is sophisticated harmonically and certainly rhythmically....Clifford Jordan took his audience to great heights and across many rivers of sound." (The personnel: Jordan, tenor; Stanley Cowell, piano; Bill Lee, bass; and Billy Higgins, drums.
